## The Moon is Real

We are currently in planning for a moon-viewing ceremony at the temple, January 6<sup>th</sup>. Why would we do this at a Buddhist temple? Precisely because we have no teachings about God or gods, we find sanctity in this life. No talk of god, lots of encountering holiness. We have Buddha's and Bodhisattvas, but they are not gods. They are channels through which the goodness of Life becomes manifest to us. For Buddhists, Life is sacred, Reality is divine.

If Reality is divine, then Buddhists should worship everything. This is true, but when monks of the Kegon school tried to exemplifying it by bowing to any object they came accross, including dog poop, they were laughed at. Not just by Japanese laypersons, also by priests of most of the other Buddhist denominations. Reality is sacred in all its dimensions but better to start with impressive objects, ... like the moon.

Some other religions often revere the moon as a symbol of something else, Buddhists revere the moon. We see the moon as the embodiment of Amida Buddha's wisest student, Dai Sesshi Bodhisattva. That is symbolic. Nonetheless, it is the actual moon that we revere, not something it symbolizes. In placing our gaze upon the moon, the light we are seeing is the wisdom of the Buddha and his Bodhisattvas. That is not a metaphor. That light, the radiation we name "moonlight" is worthy of our reverence. Wisdom is light. Shinran repeats this many times. As I would put it; - moonlight is a form of illumination; - illumination is wisdom. To find that which is sacred, we don't have to look beyond mother earth, her moon and the sun that warms them both. We are already living in the realm of the holy where the light of wisdom shines upon us; - in daytime, thanks to the sun. At night time it is thanks to both the sun and the moon.

The moon is not alive. It does not think. Nonetheless, the moon is an aspect of the Great web of life that is worthy of our reverence. This too is the Lotus land, where the sun and the moon are the embodiments of the wisdom and compassion of Awakening. Next time you watch the sunset or gaze at the moon, consider that it could be the illumination of Enlightenment, shining into your life.

## **Ho-onko Service**

Ho-onko is when we observe the death of Shinran Shonin, the founder of our sect. This service is to honor our founding teacher by gathering together and chanting Shoshinge, which was written by Shinran that summarize his teachings. As Covid permits, we will have service inperson and streamed online.

We traditionally hold our Annual General Meeting and and have our New Year lunch following this service. Due to Covid, this meal can be picked-up and eaten at home, or you have the option to dine in, as Covid restrictions permit.

## Moving into the New Year with an Unyielding Spirit

For this first article of the New Year, let me recount two stories that appeared in the September and November issues of the LA Times. Both stories may serve to encourage and even inspire you, as it did me, to live throughout the New Year with what Buddhism calls Virya or in Japanese Shojin; that is, with a spirit of unyielding energy and effort.

The first story happens to be about a 5-month-old migratory bird who set a world record by flying 8,435 miles from Alaska to its destination in the Australian state of Tasmania. The article implied that based on other similar examples, this record-breaking bird did so without stopping for food or for rest.

The second story has to do with a promising, up-and-coming freshman high school golfer. Unfortunately, this golfer suffered a stroke which resulted in a number of devastating medical conditions: Memory loss, speech defects, headaches, chronic fatigue, blood clots, excessive amount of blood in the brain, and worst of all for a golfer, tremendous pain in her write when, for example, trying to hit a ball out of a bunker.

Despite all this, this freshman golfer said to her teammates, "everyone has their own disadvantages, and this happens to be mine; just gotta (accept and) deal with it and (just) keep going (forward)."

Let us then learn from the two examples of Virya noted above and in the New Year continue to move forward toward our respective goals, whether they may be material, psychological, ethical or religious in nature and this, always with an unyielding, unbreakable spirit and energy.
